

**Pakistani Academic Muhammad Maaz Arif interviews Harry Fear in
an in-person session in Malaysia: On the moral injury and the
world's acquiescence at the Gaza genocide**

Summary:

In an interview with Harry Fear, on the Gaza situation, he claims that when ceasefires usually occur the media coverage ceases fire, despite the continuous humanitarian crisis, which includes food, displacement, and damaged hospitals. He further argues that Israel encourages the formation of gangs in the Gaza Strip in order to weaken Hamas and cause instability. Fear attacks global leaders and corporate media for what he sees as moral failure and unquestioning repetition of government narratives, while emphasizing the need of independent, crowdfunded journalism and expressing confidence that Palestine will eventually survive the crisis.

An interview with journalist and analyst **Harry Fear**¹ about the ongoing genocide in Gaza, the moral implications for the world community, and the role of the media and global leadership².

In the interview, Harry Fear believes that when **ceasefires** arise the media coverage ceases fire. He claims that Palestinians continue to die in these moments without receiving the same level of international attention. According to him, the humanitarian situation in Gaza remains exceedingly dire, with widespread starvation, a big number of people living in tents, and hospitals that are only partially operational owing to the destruction².

Fear also addresses the growth of armed **gangs in Gaza**. He says that these groups are not totally organic movements within Palestinian society, but rather are promoted by Israel in order to weaken Hamas and cause internal instability. According to him, this contributes to a climate of instability and chaos, which damages civilians even more². During the discussion, Fear sees the international response to the Gaza situation as a type of **moral injury** to the planet. He employs a strong metaphor, equating the situation to an act of a rape scene in which Israel is the offender and global leaders are passive onlookers. Using this parallel, he contends that the international community's inaction is a profound ethical failing².

The interview also calls out mainstream **corporate journalism**. Fear refers to most of it as a "tyranny of mediocrity," implying that major media sources routinely replicate government claims rather than critically scrutinizing them. He highlights the value of independent journalism supported by crowdsourcing, which he feels helps reporters to remain free of political or corporate pressure².

Despite his displeasure with the lack of worldwide acknowledgment for what he regards as horrors in Gaza, Fear **concludes** on a note of cautious optimism. He believes that Gaza and Palestine as a whole will eventually survive, and that the region's geopolitical significance will continue to influence and modify global trends².
